Over 130,000 businesses across the UK offer apprenticeships due to their effectiveness at growing a talented workforce, increasing productivity and improving business performance.

Apprenticeships are work-based training programmes which provide skills, knowledge and experience required by businesses along with a nationally recognised qualification.

Employing an apprentice can provide your business with a variety of benefits, not least the opportunity to fill identified skills gaps. Employers can choose the modules studied to ensure that the framework is best suited to their business needs.

We understand that each business is different and that a standard framework may not be suitable to all. We can work with you to create a bespoke programme tailored to your individual business needs. Brighter Futures Recruitment

Placing apprentices, supporting employers

Brighter Futures Recruitment (BFR) is an Apprenticeship Training Agency, launched in response to identified business needs. Its aim is to provide a high quality apprenticeship experience for both the employer and the apprentice.

BFR is a professional recruitment agency, which works in conjunction with Weston College and the National Apprenticeship Service (NAS). It provides a flexible solution for businesses looking to employ an apprentice, while also offering consistency of employment to the apprentice.

BFR offers three apprenticeship models to suit varying employer needs:

- The Apprenticeship Model where the apprentice is employed by you
- The Probation Model where the apprentice is employed by BFR for an agreed length of time; you can then choose to employ the apprentice for the remainder of the apprenticeship
- The Apprenticeship Training Agency Model where BFR employs the apprentice for the duration of the programme.

- We meet with you to discuss the skills needed, agree a job description and decide which apprenticeship model would be most appropriate
- We advertise the vacancy and screen potential applicants
- We then provide you with a shortlist of suitable candidates to interview
- You conduct the interviews and select which candidate to recruit
- Depending on which apprenticeship model has been chosen, the contract of employment will either be fulfilled by you or BFR
- The apprentice will receive outstanding training delivered by Weston College
- We keep in regular contact with you and the apprentice for the duration of the programme to provide support and ensure the placement remains beneficial to both parties.

APPRENTICESHIP LEVY

In the 2015 Autumn Statement, the UK Government outlined plans to increase apprenticeship participation to three million by 2020 by making funding changes and introducing an apprenticeship levy.

The levy will be introduced for employers who have an annual payroll in excess of £3m, with the first payments due in April 2017 at a rate of 0.5% paid through PAYE.

IS YOUR BUSINESS HINKLEY READY?

Weston College is working with a number of businesses to help them plan for the benefits that Hinkley Point C (HPC), as well as other major infrastructure and construction projects, will bring to the area. We can support businesses to either re-skill or up-skill their workforce and help prepare for the huge impact HPC will have on our economy.

As well as delivering apprenticeships (from Level 2-6), we offer the following:


- Flexible training solutions
 There is a wide range of learning programmes which can be designed to suit individual business needs including: work-based learning, blended learning and fast track routes.
- Sector Based Work Academies (SBWA) and Sector Based Training Academies (SBTA)

 SBWAs and SBTAs are available to cater for individual employer needs and/or the needs of a group of businesses. This bespoke training can be centred on a particular topic or identified sector need and can both complement and enhance other forms of training.

- Hinkley Point Training Agency (HPTA)
 The HPTA has been set up to help meet the skills needs the HPC. It will also support local economic growth and contribute towards meeting the aim of 34% of jobs being within a 90 minute commute and 2% apprentices. It will act as a single skills voice for HPC (adding value to the work of existing skills bodies) and skills brokerage service, including backfilling.
- The College, along with partners, has planned for the demand and opportunities that HPC will create. The offer available to businesses includes business support and signposting to services such as the Hinkley Supply Chain Portal



ENGINEERINGTHE FUTURE

The demand for qualified engineers has never been higher and it's estimated that 1.9m jobs will become available in this sector over the next five years.

In order to ensure that our provision meets the needs of the local economy, Weston College has invested £2.5m in new state-of-theart engineering facilities, (opened September 2015) at the South West Skills Campus.

This new provision offers an extensive range of high quality training to support organisations operating in the engineering, aerospace and manufacturing sectors to develop and grow future talent.

We are delivering a full engineering and manufacturing curriculum and are one of only a few colleges in the country to offer advanced composites.

As well as apprenticeships and traineeships we can provide bespoke training courses (from operation through to advanced levels), to help up-skill and/or re-skill existing employees.

The new engineering facility is home to apprentices from GKN Aerospace, Ipeco Composites Ltd. and L3.





Our brand new workshops and labs include:

Fully equipped machining workshops, materials labs, hydraulics and pneumatics labs, PLC and control systems labs, electronics workshop, CAD suites, composites workshops, 3D printing facilities and maintenance and fabrication workshops.

NEW FOR 2016

LAW AND PROFESSIONAL SERVICES ACADEMY

Weston College is creating a new Law and Professional Services Academy (LPSA) opposite the existing Knightstone Campus.

The College has secured £15 million of LEP funding, which has allowed the modification and redevelopment of the building in Lower Church Road, which forms the first phase of the LPSA project.

The second stage will see the redevelopment and modernisation of the historic Winter Gardens Pavilion, which will include replacing part of it with a new two-storey extension containing lecture theatres, seminar rooms, meeting and conference spaces, officers and associated facilities. The iconic 1920s pavilion, ballroom and other parts of the Winter Gardens will be refurbished and will remain available for wider community use.

The LPSA will act as a catalyst for the regeneration of Weston town centre, nurturing existing talent and attracting new people into the town while addressing local skills gaps and creating new jobs at the same time.



FUTURE TECHNOLOGY CENTRE

The college has secured £4.6m of additional LEP funding to develop the Future Technology Centre.

This Centre will enable the College to respond to national, regional and local skills requirements, meet the workforce and skills requirements of the Hinkley Point C development and provide a technology-ready workforce for the future.

It will upskill learners with 'work ready' technology skills across a range of sectors and disciplines including: advanced engineering/civil engineering, creative and digital, advanced design and digital techniques/technologies such as Building Information Modeling (BIM), virtual reality, low carbon and advanced technologies which support industries and learning. But we're not stopping there!

The College's £2.5m Engineering Centre opened in September 2015 and provides state-of-the-art teaching space for a full engineering and manufacturing curriculum.

The Engineering Centre, which forms the first phase of the Future Technology Centre, is based at the South West Skills Campus. It offers a wide range of engineering qualifications and skills training including; mechanical engineering, fabrication and welding, aeronautics, manufacturing, digital technologies and maintenance.



CAMPUSES AND FACILITIES

All our campuses are situated in Weston-super-Mare, within close proximity to the M5 and local train and bus routes. Our campuses offer state-of-the-art learning spaces, resource centres and sports facilities including a gymnasium with these facilities continually evolving and developing.







KNIGHTSTONE CAMPUS

Set in Weston-super-Mare's town centre, the campus has undergone extensive refurbishments and offers contemporary facilities such as commercial hair and beauty salons, an upgraded training kitchen, a simulated medical treatment room, specialist LDD facilities and provision and a University Centre devoted to degree students.

UNIVERSITY CAMPUS

Home to our creative arts courses and our Sixth Form students. The campus is one of only a few Apple Authorised Training Centres in England, with bespoke courses delivered to businesses by Apple Certified experts.

WESTON COLLEGE ACADEMY

Opening in September 2016, this campus will be home to the North Somerset Enterprise and Technology College (NSETC) students. After identifying a skills shortage in STEM subjects (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths), NSETC provides a STEM focused curriculum for students along with a strong business ethos. Businesses can work with NSETC to provide live project briefs or become a mentor to students and in return we will provide a talent stream directly to employers via placements and other opportunities.













SOUTH WEST SKILLS CAMPUS

This multi-use site has undergone a £30m renovation and was recognised for its quality and design at the Local Authority Building Control Building Excellence Awards.

The South West Skills Campus houses:

- Business Enterprise Centre (BEC)
 A specialist department which provides businesses with bespoke, work-based training and apprenticeship services.
- Construction and Engineering Centre of Excellence (CECE)


 Offering industry standard workshops and hi-tech training for the construction, civil engineering and building service sectors.
- Future Technology Centre

 The £2.5m Engineering Centre opened September 2015 and has welcomed students and apprentices from companies such as GKN, Ipeco and L3. The £4.6m LEP funded Future Technology Centre (opening 2016) will offer advanced technology skills training.
- Automotive Technology Centre
 Featuring three large workshops, computer suites with vehicle diagnostics and hi-tech classrooms.
- Sustainability Centre
 Created to train the next generation of construction workers in sustainable building techniques.

Employers and community partners are closely involved in the development of the College's curriculum, which responds very well to the needs identified locally, regionally and nationally.
