STUDENT FINALIST IN FESTIVAL OF LEARNING AWARDS

University Centre Weston (UCW) graduate Anna Palmer, a 30-year-old, who lives in Clevedon was a finalist for the Return to Learning Award at yesterday's national Festival of Learning Awards 2020. The awards celebrate learning and showcase the wideranging impacts adult learning has on individuals and their families. Anna was nominated for this award as she turned her life around following her marriage breakdown, when she decided to return to learning at Weston College.

"After my marriage separation I found the strength, with the help of my friends, to enrol on an adult course. The Level 2 Hair and Media course was an adult course at Weston College. It consisted of 3-days a week in college, so I could comfortably work part-time and be a hands-on mum with my 2 children. I absolutely loved this course and after completing it I immediately enrolled on a Level 3 Theatrical Hair and Make-up course which was also timetabled over 3-days a week so worked well for me.

"With the support of Weston College and my tutors believing that I had the potential to complete a university course, I decided to start the BA (Hons) degree in Hair, Make-up and Prosthetics for Production at UCW, and alongside this I started my own hair and make-up business called Anna Palmer's Hair/ SFX Make-up & Prosthetics. "The thought of going to university had never crossed my mind before my journey at the College, however I have now completed a BA Honours degree! "My friends and family are so proud of me. They've seen me in my darkest place and have watched me grow in determination, confidence and maturity."

Programme Coordinator for Hair Make-up and Prosthetics for Production, said: "I've taught Anna throughout her time at Weston College and UCW, and I'm so proud of the professional and personal journey she's been on and all of her wonderful achievements along the way."

FROM MEDIA STUDENT TO MAKING IT



Whilst still studying at Weston College, Harry Parslow started his own business "TourLife" and went full-time after finishing a Level 3 course in Media in 2015. TourLife has since grown from a YouTube interview show into now providing a "360 solution" for touring artists across the globe.

How did the idea start for TourLife?

TourLife started with a love for live music. I used college equipment to launch a YouTube channel that would interview touring artists when they came to town. I quickly realised that I wanted to work directly with artists instead of interviewing them. We've been in business for 5 years and now provide a 360 solution to touring artists so they can use us for everything from merchandise to video production, luxury transport to live streaming.

How has TourLife and the industry adapted during the current situation?

We've pivoted in many ways during this time. From live streaming football league matches to launching a sister company called 'ChurchStream' to broadcast ceremonies at Places of Worship. We've worked on brand partnerships with chart topping music artists and created Covid safe promotional videos for retail stores to ensure their customers feel safe.

Looking back at your time at College, was there a moment that stood out for you/inspired you?

The freedom that our tutors instilled in us to follow our dreams outside of the classroom was incredibly important. I vividly remember Dan Andrews telling me that I was "Welcome to use the college kit like it was my own" - without the kit, I wouldn't have been able to start TourLife.


We're pleased to welcome the newest member of our School Liaison Team (SLT): Megan Said!

Team North Somerset (TNS) were invited to attend a virtual meeting with ENSO in September. ENSO supports educators from across the EU with their upskilling pathways to support adults at risk of unemployment or low paid jobs due to the lack of basic skills. ENSO had heard about the work that TNS have done to support such people and were interested to hear more and invited us to share good practice.

The meeting was attended by representatives from ENSO along with EU educators from Poland; Greece; Portugal and Italy.

The whole meeting was inclusive and interactive. Lots of questions were asked as to how they could set up the type of provision that we deliver. We discussed funding opportunities and raised the profile of networking and collaboration, further explaining how by working together they could achieve more. We were able to provide practical tips on engagement with their local communities and how to raise their own profiles.

We shared some of our case studies with them to demonstrate how much they can achieve from supporting people on an individual basis and what that has meant for our participants.
