
NATWEST GUEST LECTURE SERIES

What's the duration? - Anything from 1 to 6 years depending on the level you are studying and your previous experience/qualifications



Andrew's Masterclass for Hospitality Service Sectors

Andrew Mistry came to do an online lecture with our Level 1, 2 and 3 students, the lectures began in the middle of the lockdown period where we, as a department wanted to keep our students engaged and share positive stories within the industry, especially as this industry has been hit hard by the COVID-19 pandemic.

Andrew did two sessions with our students. On the first session he spoke about his career, how he started his own restaurant along with the challenges he faced and the overall enjoyment of running of the restaurant. He then went on to talk about his current role, which is to help set up a roof top restaurant at the Sovereign Centre in Weston and during this he got the students involved with some of the activities that will be happening there.

The second session was an online cooking demo of Singapore noodles, the students asked questions online and then within that week the students all recreated the dish following Andrew's recipe demonstration and it was very successful!

This was a great opportunity for our students to complete something a little bit different but also positive within the lockdown period and seeing how the industry is changing.

SCAFFOLDING APPRENTICESHIP



Working with our partners 'Simian' Our scaffolding Apprentices are heading for End Point Assessment

At present we have 32 scaffold apprentices across 5 different cohorts, the course is set over 22 months during which time they attend college on five occasions for 10-day courses.

Each course teaches them the theory and practical skills needed to eventually achieve the recognised industry standard of a part 2 scaffolder. During their visits to the College, they also receive functional skills training along with Safeguarding, Prevent and British Values. The students also complete a portfolio during their apprenticeship journey.

The first cohort were taken on in September 2019 and came from areas around Oxford, Bristol, and Wellington. Although they have had a few breaks from learning due to the pandemic, they are back on track and will complete their End Point Assessment at the end of July.

All students have achieved a Level 1 in Maths and English, and some have been working towards Level 2 with the help of Sheena and her team. The most recent cohort joined us in November last year and have attended college to complete two of their 10-day courses, Foundation, and Part 1A.

It was great to receive a 100% pass rate from their instructors at the Construction Training Centre for both courses and we look forward to welcoming them back for their Part 1B in July.

We have learnt a great deal about how to manage this apprenticeship and offer the best support to these students during their time with us and look forward to welcoming our new cohort in June.

I am extremely proud of the Year 2 Aerospace Engineering Degree apprentices Taylor, Jansen, Ethan, Harry and Chloe from GKN completing their Project Management (work-based learning) with an outcome that has and will be a talking point for years to come!

They have demonstrated their application of the knowledge, skills and behaviours required for the apprenticeship throughout their entire project including communication, collaboration, repair and assembly, health and safety, hazards and risks, as well as logistics and transportation.

I am touched and proud of the students Taylor, Jansen, Ethan, Harry and Chloe for reaching out for me to support them with their project and also grateful for the support from staff to make this happen including Andy Davidson, Paul Knight, Ben Hodder, Iain Forster and Ed Carey.
