How the English Functional Skills course has improved email writing in the workplace!

Two of our assessors have been working with Wessex Water employees this year and have really enjoyed the experience.

Jed Randal has been working with Wessex Water apprentices on their Functional Skills English and maths. He said:

"All the learners have shown real commitment and enthusiasm towards their studies and have gained some amazing results."

"The course ran daily for two hours, via Teams, over a period of four weeks. The exams were taken in the last week at the College campus. We used OneNote to share content and give feedback, which proved to be an invaluable package during the pandemic. Lots of the learners were new to this and they have taken to the delivery method exceptionally well.

"The learners work in locations covering Devon, Taunton and North Somerset. Their commitment to the fast track courses has been incredible. All of the learners have engaged really well; juggling a hectic and busy working day at the same time.

"The participation in the sessions was great - I must say that they were a pleasure to teach. I want to thank them for making the most out of the lessons and gaining their Level 2 in Functional Skills maths and English. Well done!"

"After a relatively short time I felt they were ready for their exams - Every single student achieved their Level 2 functional skills in English!


"This is incredible, especially as they were working remotely often onsite with construction going on whilst they sat in their cars or in staff rooms working towards the qualification.

Farm to Fork event at Puxton Park.


Year 10 & 11 students joined us to learn more about the food journey and careers within the hospitality and catering sector.

WE HAVE JOINED WE WORK FOR EVERYONE

Weston College and North Somerset Council are delighted to join the WE WORK for Everyone project - an exciting opportunity to help support people with learning difficulties and disabilities (SEND) who need extra support to move into employment.

The aim of project is to offer a unified approach Bristol, South Gloucestershire, BANES, North Somerset and Somerset to improve employment outcomes for people with learning difficulties. The key commitments are to empower people with learning difficulties, develop independence and support a seamless transition into the workplace.

The project will also be working with employers to raise awareness to help them to understand the benefit of an inclusive and diverse work forces.

As part of this project Weston College have employed SEND Employment Navigators that are ready to work with participants to develop a training programmes to develop the skills needed and their confidence in applying for the right job alongside supporting employers to create inclusive workplaces. The Navigators can support with:

- Matching participants to the right job pathway
- Accessing training to develop the skills ready for work
- Arranging work placements
- Designing CV's
- Supporting with job searching and completing applications forms
- Preparing for job interviews
- Working with employers to understand the support needed
- Developing digital skills
- Accessing computer equipment.

The project is open to anyone who lives in the North Somerset, is over 16, is not in employment and has a learning difficulty or learning disability (SEND).

My daughter is currently a first year student studying for the BTEC Level 3 Extended Diploma in Construction and the Build Environment (Clvil Engineering) at your South West Skills Campus.
