JOB CONTEXT

The Specialist Provision at Weston College leads the field and is pro-active in informing the sector, sharing good practice and developing inclusive provision for all learners.

Our aim is to provide high quality programmes which support learners to understand how their barriers impact on their learning and how they can work with the specialist SEND teams to access a curriculum which addresses their individual needs, aspirations and vocational focus. We are looking for a highly trained and experienced support workers to join the SEND provision to ensure learners with SEND, empowering learner's independence, setting high expectations and creating a culture that enables learners with SEND to excel.

JOB PURPOSE

To provide high quality individualised support for an individual and/or small group of learners who need high levels of support to re-engage in education in order to progress onto a wide range of courses across the college and/or employment. An understanding, working knowledge and previous experience of working with learners with SEND/barriers to learning is crucial.

The post-holder will contribute to the provision of a safe, healthy and inclusive environment for learners who have identified SEND and/or are at risk of becoming NEET. The role will require working in partnership with specialist practitioners, parents/carers and external organisations to ensure learners access high quality inclusive support.

The post will also involve working collaboratively with both Foundation Learning teaching teams, cross college lecturers, external partners to ensure seamless transitions between courses, schools, colleges and partner organisations to ensure a high-quality provision. You may be required to work within a wider Multi-agency Team liaising with and attending multi-disciplinary training sessions.



The successful candidate will work well collaboratively and will be open minded and keen to learn from the experiences of other SEND Practitioners. They will be capable of working independently, prioritising and organising their own workload appropriately. Candidates should be dynamic and enthusiastic.

KEY TASKS AND DUTIES

The person appointed will be responsible to an identified line manager within the area, the Subject Area Manager and ultimately to the Dean of Faculty for the following:

- To provide individualised practical and/or personal care support to learners on all programmes within the Faculty and across the curriculum to meet individual learning needs;
- To support the learners on a 1:1, small group basis both within the classroom, community or workshop environment under the direction of SEND Specialist Practitioners;
- To work on an individual basis with learners in accordance with their individual targets and encourage aspirational attitudes to learning;
- To be competent with the use of technology and associated programmes and software and to implement digital technologies to empower independence;
- To give practical and or personal care and assistance as necessary to learners with during break periods and lunch times when teaching staff are not on duty; movement in and around the college; use of college amenities (toilet, washroom, refectory, library+ facilities', college elective programme) and to prepare travel arrangements at the beginning and end of the daily session;
- To implement individualised Support plans and/or Health Care Plans in agreement and collaboration with all parties, monitoring as required;
- To seek and receive advice and support from SEND Specialist Practitioners, External Professionals as appropriate;
- To support the learners and tutors in the classroom setting if necessary, empowering their independence and developing strategies to support their learning and independence;
- At times there may be a need to escort named learners to and from home to College and provide mobility training;



- To ensure that Health and Safety Regulations and all other policies and procedures in place are complied with at all times;
- Participate in regular supervision and mentoring, taking part in regular CPD to enhance understanding of SEND and inclusive practice;
- To carry out other such duties and undertake all relevant training opportunities as required and as are commensurate with the grade of post.
- Comply with Information Security requirements, in line with Weston College policy.

CONTACTS

Appropriate teaching and non-teaching staff throughout the college, but especially within the Faculty of Inclusive Practice. Also the Local Education Authority, the public, parents/carers, schools and specialist agencies and medical/social welfare where necessary.

HEALTH AND SAFETY

All staff have a duty to maintain the safe and clean conditions of their workplace area and to co-operate with Weston College on matters of Health and Safety. This will include assisting with risk assessments and carrying out appropriate actions, as required. Staff are required to refer to Weston College's Health and Safety Policies in respect to their specific duties and responsibilities.

STAFF DEVELOPMENT

All staff are required to participate fully in Weston College's staff development programmes and have a responsibility to identify their own professional development needs in conjunction with their line manager.

SPECIAL NOTES OR CONDITIONS

The post is term-time only (38 weeks – academic year), working 37 hours per week. Holidays must therefore, be taken outside the terms of the academic year. The post holder may, on occasions, be required to work irregular hours.
